From the moment a patient is diagnosed, we're there every step of the way. We create more opportunities for better outcomes. One way we do this is by providing patient assistance grants to help families cover out-of-pocket expenses related to transplant.

Since these grants became available, 1,020 patients in California have received financial assistance totaling \$2,369,986 to help more patients go through the transplant process. Of these patients, 18% were children.

- Since 1987, NMDP has facilitated more than 125,000 transplants. In 2023, NMDP impacted 7,435 lives through cell therapy.
- Today, patients have access to more than
 41 million potential donors worldwide.
- In 2023, NMDP provided \$5.5 million in patient assistance grants to more than 2,600 families.

- Accelerating Progress: Underscoring NMDP's commitment
 to expanding access to cell therapy, we recently published
 findings showing that using expanded matching criteria
 could result in a nearly three-fold increase in the likelihood
 of securing a suitable donor. This breakthrough dramatically
 increases the chances of finding a match on the national
 registry, offering cell transplantation as a viable, life-saving
 therapy, regardless of ancestry.

Gratitude is a part of everyday life for Scott. When his daughter Taryn was seven years old, she was diagnosed with severe aplastic anemia, a condition that occurs when the body can no longer produce enough new blood cells.

Unfortunately, no one among Taryn's relatives was a match for transplant, so the family turned to NMDP to help find a potential donor. "The prognosis for her well-being and having a healthy future was very grim," Scott recalled.

Fortunately, a donor was found, giving Taryn a second chance at life. Today, Taryn is a teenager and doing well. Scott's daily routine of gratitude is grounded by the generosity of a stranger.

"Without NMDP, we would not have found my daughter's donor," Scott said.

While the family initially got involved with NMDP when Taryn was diagnosed, Scott said he quickly knew that he would have a life-long connection with the organization. "I've assisted at several hundred registration events where 5,000 or more people have joined the registry," he said.

Along with donor drives, Scott is also a volunteer courier who helps deliver donated bone marrow and blood cells to patients in need.

"My favorite part about being an advocate is realizing how invaluable NMDP is in terms of providing hope for families who are going through the biggest challenge of their lives."
