Your support helps push the boundaries of what's possible.

From the moment a patient is diagnosed, we're there every step of the way. We create more opportunities for better outcomes. One way we do this is by providing patient assistance grants to help families cover out-of-pocket expenses related to transplant.

Since these grants became available, **367 patients in Illinois** have received financial assistance totaling **\$840,892 to help more patients** go through the transplant process. Of these patients, **23% were children.**

- Since 1987, NMDP has facilitated more than 125,000 transplants. In 2023, NMDP impacted 7,435 lives through cell therapy.
- Today, patients have access to more than **41 million** potential donors worldwide.
- In 2023, NMDP provided \$5.5 million in patient assistance grants to more than 2,600 families.

- Entrusted by Congress for 35+ years: Since the inception of the C.W. Bill Young Cell Transplantation Program (the national registry), Congress has authorized NMDP to oversee the program.
- NMDP finds cures and saves lives. NMDP manages the most diverse listing of potential donors in the world (the national registry).
- We treat and cure over 75 diseases through cell therapy.
- Accelerating Progress: Underscoring NMDP's commitment to expanding access to cell therapy, we recently published findings showing that using expanded matching criteria could result in a nearly three-fold increase in the likelihood of securing a suitable donor. This breakthrough dramatically increases the chances of finding a match on the national registry, offering cell transplantation as a viable, life-saving therapy, regardless of ancestry.

My dad was diagnosed with non-Hodgkin lymphoma (NHL) in 1997 about a year after I was born. Unfortunately, my family couldn't find a potential donor among my dad's relatives or through the national registry.

Over the next 20 years, my dad remained a wonderful presence in my life despite his health challenges. He would let me paint his nails on my birthday every year. He cooked for a high school musical cast of 100. He even served as my Brownie troop leader.

Eventually, my dad's cancer stopped responding to treatment. His doctors at the University of Wisconsin—Madison told my parents about a clinical trial that was pending approval. Thankfully, my dad's wait for transplant came to an end because of scientific advancements. In fact, he became the third person in the U.S. to ever receive cells from a half-match! As his donor, I was filled with love and joy to give him this second chance at life, especially after everything he has given me.

After donating to my dad in the summer of 2016, I returned to Bradley University and helped establish Bradley's first NMDP Chapter to recruit potential donors to join the registry. As president of the Bradley speech team, I traveled to eight states, speaking to more than 2,000 people about the therapeutic benefits of healthy blood cell and bone marrow transplant.

In 2021, I joined the NMDP Advocacy Volunteer Program and was tasked with forming meaningful relationships with my senators and representatives. It is truly inspiring work and my way of expressing gratitude for every new day I have with my dad.
