Since these grants became available, **46 patients** in Louisiana have received financial assistance totaling **\$91,295 to help more patients** go through the transplant process.

- Since 1987, NMDP has facilitated more than 125,000 transplants. In 2023, NMDP impacted 7,435 lives through cell therapy.

- NMDP finds cures and saves lives. NMDP manages the most diverse listing of potential donors in the world (the national registry).
- We treat and cure over 75 diseases through cell therapy.
- Accelerating Progress: Underscoring NMDP's commitment
 to expanding access to cell therapy, we recently published
 findings showing that using expanded matching criteria
 could result in a nearly three-fold increase in the likelihood
 of securing a suitable donor. This breakthrough dramatically
 increases the chances of finding a match on the national
 registry, offering cell transplantation as a viable, life-saving
 therapy, regardless of ancestry.

Hillary had fought and beat two kinds of blood cancer before she was diagnosed for a third time with an aggressive form of leukemia. She quickly reached a point where her only chance to survive was to find a bone marrow donor. With no matches in her family, she turned to the national registry.

Though she matched with several potential donors, Hillary explained that the worry doesn't immediately come to an end. Only one person was willing and physically able to say yes to donating.

"There is anxiety waiting to find a match. And then there is more anxiety until the transplant is there," she said.

Hillary was able to get her transplant and has been in remission for over 10 years. In that time, she graduated college and earned a doctorate.

The weekend of her wedding, Hillary was able to meet her donor in person for the first time. She didn't realize it at the time, but her wedding day fell on her donor's wedding anniversary.

"We matched based on genetic markers, and he took time out of his day for a stranger. It meant literally everything to me. If he hadn't been there, answering the call, I wouldn't be here," Hillary said.

Every moment of joy or accomplishment since her third diagnosis was made possible because of NMDP and the national registry.

"Because of all the privilege I have, I can advocate. I can give back in every way I can. I can be a voice for those who can't advocate right now...You never know when you are going to be the one on the other side."
